

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS: STUDY PERMITS

If you are studying in Canada for more than six months, you are required to have a study permit from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). IRCC requires that you maintain full-time academic status, which is equivalent to nine academic credits at CapU for each major term, in order to be eligible to work off campus or to be eligible for a post-graduation work permit after you complete your studies. A co-op work permit is required for all programs where a practicum is a graduation requirement.

Exchange or Visiting International Students

You do not need a study permit if you plan to take a course or program in Canada that lasts six months or less.

Citizens from certain countries are required to have a temporary resident visa.

Online Programs

As an international student, you may apply for admission to online programs, but you will not be eligible for a study permit.
